Media who need working space in the press box should request it through Erik Schroeder or Lea Crowley. Seating will be limited in the press box. For featured games, media members will be assigned seats in the press seating area and seating assignments will be posted throuhgout the press box.

FIELD MEDIA POLICY

Due to limited space in the press box at Jerome T. Osborne, Sr. Stadium, approved media and photographers will be permitted on the sidelines and are expected to honor all sideline policies. Media members and photographers are not allowed in the team bench areas, locker rooms, or other restricted areas in the stadium.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Credentials for photographers will be issued to those representing newspapers, bona fide publications, and other periodicals by Erik Schroeder or Lea Crowley. Please make requests in advance. All photographers are expected to honor all sideline policies and are not permitted in the team bench areas, locker rooms, or other restricted areas within Jerome T. Osborne, Sr. Stadium without prior, written authorization from the Lake Catholic Athletic Department.

MEDIA WILL CALL

Approved media or photo credentials can be obtained at the Media Will Call window located at the northwest ticket gate of Jerome T. Osborne, Sr. Stadium. The Media Will Call window opens approximately 90 minutes before the game.

Jerome T. Osborne, Sr. Stadium

HOME OF THE LAKE CATHOLIC COUGARS

Jerome T. Osborne, Sr. Stadium is the home to the Lake Catholic Cougars varsity football team. The facility was renovated prior to the start of the 2006 season and has been updated and enhanced prior to 2014 and 2023 seasons.



The stadium is often referred to as 'The JTO'.

As part of the original renovations of the JTO, the Osborne family earmarked \$750,000 to the Mentor School District to install an artificial turf football field, a new rubberized track and a new scoreboard at the stadium. Lake Catholic High School also donated \$300,000 to the initial project and the Cougars played the first-ever football game in the renovated stadium on Aug. 26, 2006 against the Euclid Panthers. The facility has a total capacity of 8,000.

COUGARS DROP CONFERENCE OPENER TO UNDEFEATED ROYALS

Lake Catholic had its four-game winning streak snapped as visiting CVCA defeated the Cougars, 28-21, at the JTO on Sept. 26.

Lake Catholic's Brady Moran recovered a fumble early in the fourth quarter against CVCA, the Cougars' third forced turnover of the contest.



Liam Coyne connected with Guy Dominick on the ensuing offensive drive for a TD and cut the Royals' lead to a one-score game with under % minutes left.

But the Royals were able to grind out the clock with an 11-play drive to seal the victory and remain undefeated.

Both sides established the running game in their first dives, as both attempted just one pass. The Royals opened the game with a 77-yard drive, capped by a 7-yard touchdown pass from Charley Levak to Brayden Harris

The Cougars had a similar drive, going 75 yards finished by a Danny Zmorowski 3-yard run.

But CVCA responded two plays later, with Levak finding Harris again, this time for a 59-yard TD.

The Cougars went three-and-out but got the ball back on the Royals' next offensive play as Marty Loncar recovered a fumble at the Royals' 37. Zmorowski again found the end zone from two yards out, but again, the Royals responded with a five-play drive ending with a Joey Kopec 41-yard touchdown run.

With two minutes left in the half, the Royals took a shot downfield but Joey Nagy held on for the interception, the Cougars' second forced turnover. Coyne found Dominick for a 43-yard gain to get Lake Catholic inside the 25. but the drive stalled out and ended in a turnover on downs.

Lake Catholic came out of the half with a turnover on downs that set CVCA up inside the Cougars' side of the 50. Six plays later, Kopec had his second score of the game, this on a two-yard scamper.

The Royals didn't pass the ball in the second half, earning all 117 yards on the ground.

Lake Catholic was led by Zmorowski's 93 yard rushing and two scores, while Dominick had 56 receiving yards and a TD.

The junior Defensive End has also been a strong performer on the Scout Defense the past several weeks. Jack Kovatch, a sophomore Corner, had a leaping interception in the back of the endzone to end a CVCA threat.

Reserve Game Summary

The Lake Catholic Reserve Team found themselves in another close battle on Thursday, September 25th. The Madison Blue Streaks held on to win by four. The Cougars scored about halfway through the fourth quarter and seemed poised to steal a game that Madison had been in control of. However, the Blue Streaks held the ball for the remainder of the game, spoiling the Cougars rally.

Freshman QB Joey Park completed 11 of 17 passes for 98 yards, along with a 12 yard touchdown pass and a conversion pass to Freshman running back Nico Piccirillo.

Piccirillo had 80 scrimmage yards on 7 touches. He had 3 carries for 33 yards and 4 catches for 47 yards to go with his touchdown and conversion. Backfield mate Jacob Grubach toted it 11 times for 53 yards to lead the Cougars rushing attack. Colin Kleppel continued his strong freshman season by adding a 7 yard touchdown in the second half.

Freshman Colton Kastings caught a 2 point conversion in the 4th quarter as well.

Kleppel had an interception for the Cougars on defense.

Changes to OHSAA Playoffs

There will be four less qualifiers in each region in the 2025 Ohio high school football playoffs.

The Ohio High School Athletic Association announced in June that the number of football teams qualifying for the 2025 postseason will be reduced from 16 to 12 per region.

The top four seeds in each region will receive first-round byes beginning this season.

The first three rounds will be hosted by higher seeds instead of the first two rounds, which would allow a top-four seed to still get two home playoff games.

With the top four seeds receiving byes, lower seeds will visit higher seeds in the first round.

The No. 5 seed in each region will host the No. 12 seed, No. 6 will host No. 11, No. 7 will host No. 10 and No. 8 will host No. 9.

The OHSAA expanded to 16 teams per region in 2021. In the four years of those expanded playoffs:

- No. 1 seeds were 111-1, with the lone win coming in 2021.
- No. 2 seeds were 105-7 while
- No. 3 seeds were 101-11.

Last fall, No. 1 seeds went 28-0 across seven divisions with an average margin of victory of 42 points.

Expanded playoffs began in 1985. At the beginning of that season, The OHSAA doubled the number of playoff teams per region, moving from two to four teams per region.

In 1999 expansion of the playoff format occurred again, as eight schools per region qualified for the playoffs, creating a regional quarterfinal round.

Early in 2020, the OHSAA approved a proposal from the Ohio High School Football Coaches Association to expand to 12 teams per region.

(In 2020, the OHSAA made pandemic adjustments to the football post season, allowing all schools to participate)

In the last four seasons, the OHSAA used a format that allowed up to 16 teams in each region to qualify for the playoffs






